Message from the President on projects



As you might know by now, CEO Ellana Aarons and I are working through a number of 'big ticket' items for B'nai B'rith which follow on from the strategic workshops that were conducted in late 2021. Ellana and I have just written an issues paper on projects, with several others in the pipeline including positioning of the organisation (the strategic vision), units, policies such as privacy, finance and marketing.

The aim of these 'issues papers' and subsequent discussions at the B'nai B'rith Executive and Victorian B'nai B'rith Council is to try to ensure that we are as efficient and focused as a modern organisation can be. I shall report on these in due course.

The project area is an interesting one. We have classified BB projects in two ways: by content and by 'ownership'. Content covers the main goals of BB which are to: support the needy, promote human rights and foster understanding, celebrate our achievers and support Israel. Ownership refers to whether a project belongs principally to a unit, BBVic or B'nai B'rith Australia/New Zealand.

Classifying projects in this way helps us to understand who is primarily responsible for them. It also helps us to work through some very important issues including the degree to which the BB office staff can and should assist them, to what extent they are financially self-sufficient and who provides the leadership. Getting down to the nitty gritty in this way can lead to both angst and argument, especially on matters such as how much 'free time' should the office staff give and to what extent should B'nai B'rith cover shortfalls in project costs. In the end, these issues have to be sorted out on a project-by-project basis.

Streamlining processes, promoting financial accountability and providing a more uniform 'branding' for a range of projects are all important tasks, and these are being worked through. This will help us become more efficient and focused. The real question will then be, 'Where does focus and efficiency get us?'

B'nai B'rith is currently involved with approximately 16 projects of which less than half could be classified as principally B'nai B'rith ones. Is that too many? Are they the 'right' projects to bring in wider participation and sponsorship? Can the general Jewish community understand what we do when paradoxically we seem to do so much?

You can see why I have labelled this a 'big ticket' item. Focus and efficiency are only step one; the more profound challenge is to do that which revitalises our B'nai B'rith and enables it to be handed on to the next generation.

At our forthcoming convention President of the Lions Association in Australia, Tony Benbow OAM will be a special guest speaker, sharing the Lions experiences that mirror ours in terms of ageing membership and continued relevance.
