Message from the President on our media policy



The philosopher Aristotle said that, “The whole is greater than the sum of the parts.” This applies to what B’nai B’rith in Victoria is trying to do. We have many wonderful projects and activities, but when it comes to projecting a united and meaningful organisation to a broad cross-section of the Jewish community, we have to be more than the sum total of these individual entities.

One aspect of this organisation-wide approach is to make sure that when B’nai B’rith speaks to the media, it does so in a consistent and positive way. This means that separate voices from individuals, even if they are Unit Presidents or project leaders, need to be aware of how the organisation must encourage consistent and positive messaging. This can only be done by having sign-off to media posts at ‘the top’, that is by the President of B’nai B’rith Victoria, supported by the CEO.

Of course, repeated promotion for the same or similar event does not require repeated sign-off. This ‘media policy’ needs to be sensible and workable, and not a major bureaucratic hurdle.

And what are these media contributions? They include letters to the editor, interviews by journalists, radio and TV commentaries and social media posts. Timeliness can be an issue. For example, one can be easily caught off-guard by being asked by a journalist at a public event what one thinks of something that B’nai B’rith is doing. It is one thing to try to describe what B’nai B’rith is doing and emphasising that one is speaking privately; the problem arises if one sounds like one is giving an official response. This can be due either to the role that the individual plays in B’nai B’rith or the content of what they say. One has to be careful and be mindful of the ‘media policy’ which emphasises the need to have a consistent and positive message to the public which should be ‘signed off’ whenever possible.

The media policy is only one of several policies and papers that we are currently developing. Other statements will include event and privacy policies. These are based on discussions at the Executive and the Victorian B’nai B’rith Council. I shall continue to write about our evolving series of policies as they are developed and approved by our governing bodies.

Message from the BBANZ President



It is less than four months until our Triennial Convention which will again be held in Melbourne, and there are a number of people working very hard to ensure that this Convention will have purpose. The theme will be about making B'nai B'rith bigger and stronger as we head into the future.

If you are not directly involved in organising for the Convention and have views on what can make B'nai B'rith bigger and stronger, please share those views at this Convention.

B'nai B'rith International is supplying me with a weekly list of upcoming programs and says it is the home for interviews and podcasts. It has "meaningful discussions on today's most pressing and interesting issues". If anyone is interested in obtaining copies of these interviews and podcasts, please let me know and I will endeavour to send them to you.

Another function that our District carries out is to attend (over Zoom) bi-monthly meetings of the Executive Council of Australian Jewry (ECAJ). ECAJ is the peak representative body of the Australian Jewish Community.

In an article that ECAJ recently published, it reported the growing trend of hate incidents in Australia over the past seven years in relation to Jewish people. For instance, in 2015 there were 190 documented anti-Jewish hate incidents in Australia, whereas in 2021 there were 447 documented such incidents. It is a disturbing growth, although it didn't relate to Jewish people, when a deranged young man in Buffalo New York State just walked into a grocery store and shot dead ten people because of the colour of their skin. Anti-Jewish incidents in Australia have been collected and documented by the ECAJ since 1990 and the documentation was spurred on by a spate of arson attacks in Sydney in 1990 and 1991. I was heavily involved with two of those synagogues, Bankstown and Illawarra, during those times, including holding the position of President of each of those synagogues and I know what damage was caused. In the last seven years, hate incidents against Jews have been far greater than hate incidents against Muslims and Asians. If you see something bad happening, please report it.

On a lighter note, it is wonderful to see so many great activities happening in B'nai B'rith in both Melbourne and Sydney and, I hope, in Auckland. Finally, we are getting back to where we were at the end of 2019.

The performance was comprised of a play reading by 4 actors representing Spinoza's immediate family and a Rabbi at the time the edict was given to excommunicate Spinoza by the Jewish Community.

The director of the play reading was George Werther who has had more than 30 years experience in community theatre.

The audience also watched two videos prepared by the author Ron Rosenfeld. Extensive research had gone into the production of these videos highlighting historical events and implications affecting the Jewish people in the 17th Century in Europe.

On leaving the performance, the audience was full of praise for the production, the organization and for the amount of information that they gained about the great philosopher Baruch Spinoza.

Prior to the show the audience heard about the aims of "Making a Difference" and over \$3800 was raised for the charity!

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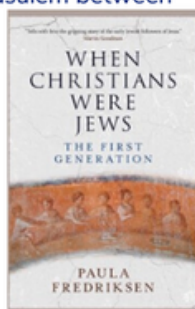
B'NAI B'RITH JEWISH NON-FICTION BOOK CLUB

Courage to Care announces a significant funding boost on its 30th Anniversary - providing students access to Anti-Discrimination education across Victoria.

For 30 years, Courage to Care has been educating and empowering students across Victoria to stand up against racism and discrimination by being ‘Upstanders’. This generational impact has been wholly delivered free of charge to Victorian schools by a team of skilled and dedicated volunteers including inspiring first-person testimonies from Holocaust Survivor Speakers who were saved by Upstander action. However, as CEO Mike Zervos commented, ‘Our work is far from done’. The Victorian Government today announced a grant of an additional two million dollars which will enable Courage to Care to expand its Upstander Program to support a mix of school visits, a year 9 outreach program in rural and regional schools, and virtual visits. Premier Daniel Andrews stated yesterday, “It’s critical that we teach every generation about the horrors of the Holocaust to fight intolerance and prejudice in our own communities – because there is absolutely no room for antisemitism in Victoria.” State Education Minister and Deputy Premier James Merlino added, “Courage to Care’s Holocaust education program is a powerful and compelling experience for students and school communities – and we’re proud to expand it to make sure every Victorian student can participate.”

Mr Zervos said Courage to Care is fighting against racism and intolerance by working at a grassroots level with school students across Victoria to create a generation of Upstanders rather than bystanders. ‘We are enabling students to stand up against racism and broader societal issues such as homophobia, ableism, sexism and bullying generally,’ he said. ‘This commitment from the Victorian Government represents a significant moment of growth for Courage to Care and will truly allow us to achieve our mission - to create a generation of Upstanders - one school at a time.’ ‘The Scanlon Foundation Research Institute - which monitors changes in social attitudes in Australia - reported that in 2020, 40 per cent of respondents thought racism in Australia was either a very big or fairly big problem. By the end of 2021, that number swelled to 60 per cent,’ he said. ‘Worryingly, these figures aren’t just thoughts - they are real.’ Similar numbers were reported in the Asian community, with the Asian Australian Alliance reporting that they have received more than 500 reports of racist incidents against Asian Australians in the past year. The Community Security Groups across Australia reported 490 antisemitic incidents in Australia during 2021, a 38 per cent increase over 2020 and the highest on record. Gandel Foundation’s first national survey of Holocaust knowledge reported almost a quarter (24%) of adult Australians have little to no knowledge of the Holocaust. And that number rises to a staggering 30% among millennials. Despite these alarming insights, most Australians (88%) agree: we can learn lessons for today from what happened in the Holocaust. Susan Hearst’s mother is a Holocaust Survivor, who survived only because a stranger was brave enough to be an Upstander, in the most extreme of circumstances. Ms Hearst volunteers with Courage to Care, sharing her mother’s story to students across Victoria, with an inspiring message, that we can all be Upstanders against racism, discrimination and prejudice in our schools and communities. Ms Hearst said ‘My mother said her survival was a miracle. Through telling her story, I have the unique privilege of honouring my family, and the Upstanders whose bravery saved thousands of lives, including mine. By having open discussions with students, we empower them to become Upstanders, wherever they encounter prejudice and discrimination. We are creating a generation of Upstanders, so that our grandchildren will live in a better world.’

Courage to Care welcomes all members of the community to a series of free public events to celebrate its 30th anniversary, at the ARK Centre in Hawthorn East between Tuesday 24 May and Thursday 2 June 2022.
