Message from the President: The Philosophers amongst us

The B'nai B'rith Bernard Lustig Scholarship is awarded each year for outstanding university students to help them pursue their postgraduate studies. One of last year's winners was Yonatan Genende who is now studying at Oxford University. He wrote to Paul Gardner (who chairs the committee) to express his thanks and stated: "I'm particularly grateful to you for your ongoing support at a time like this—a period of great uncertainty for everyone, but also the humanities itself, when funding is increasingly hard to secure. Times like this highlight the value of the humanities: when people have time to reflect on what matters, and where our basic assumptions relating to work, the economy, politics and social life demand a rethink. Philosophy deals with these issues with a rigor and breadth that is vital, and has much to contribute. I hope to be able to use this knowledge ... in my own way... to contribute to some of the challenges we will face". Wise words from our young philosophy student. We saw an excellent example of philosophy in action at our Speakers Forum last month when the internationally famous Professor Peter Singer AC addressed us on the ethics of effective altruism. He spoke on donations being spent wisely where they can have the greatest impact – which happens to be in projects to help poor people like those in Sub-Sahara Africa. In response to a question from Chair Peter Schattner on whether we should also give to the poor in Israel, Singer responded that as a philosopher we felt that Israel was rich enough to support its own relatively poor people and money is better spent on helping the desperately poor by preventing deadly diseases like malaria which is cheap and effective to do. I know this comment caused a lot of discussion after the meeting, but it made us all think about how we make decisions on difficult issues and to which values we give priority. As part of our organisation's planning process for the future, we researched what B'nai B'rith is doing in other countries. We found out that the priorities of BB around the world are quite variable as shown in the summary below:

BB USA – Fighting anti-semitism and "defending Israel on the world stage". Also focus on providing housing for the elderly.

BB France – Fighting widespread anti-semitism in Europe and the anti-Israel lobby. Involved in Jewish Culture and Heritage education for the general public.

BB Israel - Approximately 70 lodges, organized into regional councils. Each lodge plans its own activities, some of which include: helping schools, kindergartens, hospitals' clubs for the blind, and recent immigrants; delivering food and clothes to needy people.

BB UK – Supports charities in the UK, Israel and Ukraine. Promotes Heritage and Culture activities.

We had a 90 minute Zoom session with the BB UK leaders earlier this month (led by their President Alan Miller) where we found out that, like us, they are also battling with declining membership numbers and needing to adapt to changing times. We learnt about their education programs and explored 'what works' in our two jurisdictions. Both groups felt at the end of the Zoom meeting "that we now know that we are not alone!" In the short term, the prime role for us all is to get through this COVID pandemic period by staying safe and supporting each other. We want each member to know that they are an important part of our BB family and of our Jewish community. This sense of belonging is important for our own physical and mental health. By next year, we hope to be able to start expanding our programs, especially those aimed at active people in their 50s and over, who want to contribute to their community. We plan to get greater professional input into running BBVic and focus on our community services as well as meeting the growing interest for education of Jewish culture and heritage within the Jewish community in Melbourne.

This past month, we have had a sad time of losing three of our stalwart members who have each made enormous contributions to B'nai B'rith over many decades. We mourn Past Presidents Eva Rathner OAM, Ben Alexander OAM and Sol Bud. May their memories be a blessing.

It is no secret that the membership in both Australia and the UK has greatly declined over the last 20 years. A Zoom meeting was held to discuss each others' future plans, especially regarding Jewish Culture and Heritage Projects. This meeting was well attended on both sides of the world with a lot of fruitful discussions. I am sure Benny will have a lot more to say on this meeting. So that will do until I next blink my eyes. My thoughts go out to all of you in Melbourne under lock-down and let us all hope and pray things get back to normal sooner rather than later.

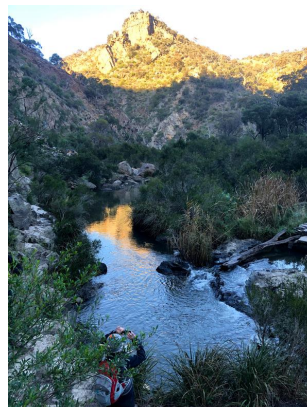

May Her Memory Be A Blessing*

Sad News: It was with profound sadness that we learnt of the passing of Eva Rathner. Eva brought so much to B'nai B'rith Courage to Care (Vic) that it is hard to summarise. Her enthusiasm and positivity, and her palpable kindness, touched all who came to know her. She contributed as a custodian speaker, as a member of the management committee, as a facilitator who so easily connected with students, as school caller, as caterer and packer and suggester of ideas. As one of the longest long-running volunteers in many roles, she gave her heart and soul to Courage to Care as she did to everything. Our deepest condolences to her family – her memory truly will be a blessing.

Brighton Secondary College: You may have seen the recently reported Antisemitic incidents at Brighton Secondary College. It angers us all to see yet another example of such outrageous behaviour. Although there can be a temptation to directly contact and criticise the school, our overwhelming experience is to be seen as part of the educational solution to this and other school communities. This is in line with how we responded to the schools in 2019 and we have been in touch with the Department of Education and offered our upstander program (however possible) and suggested we be part of their recommended actions and response at Brighton Secondary College. This sort of incident reinforces the need for our programs in Victorian schools.

What's happening at Courage to Care?

With the renewed Covid-19 restrictions, and the postponement of our face to face program delivery again, it's natural to be wondering what there is to do for our volunteer team. **Remote Learning** - A team of experts in various fields is working on developing ideas for how we may adapt our upstander programs for remote delivery using platforms similar to Zoom (with which we've all become familiar!), using techniques proven in school environments. The aim is to maintain our high standards while avoiding onerous technology that gets in the way of team members actually doing what they do best – delivering the programs. **Introducing new volunteer and providing training** - This is the perfect time to pick up new skills, brush up on old ones, and deepen your understanding in pertinent areas of knowledge. Zoi has done an enormous amount of work reconfiguring and revising training modules so they can be delivered remotely via Zoom. We're also designing further professional skills development modules for extended learning that will be rolled out as they are completed.
