As a consequence, I have suggested to the Bundespresident (Premier) that in recognition for your services the state considers that you are awarded the Verdienstorden of the German Republic. I have pleasure in advising you that the Bundespresident has agreed that you are awarded this recognition to acknowledge the services you have rendered to the country over a long period. I congratulate you on receiving this award in recognition of your services. Regarding the presentation the German Embassy in Canberra will be in contact with you to make suitable arrangements for the facilitation of the award.

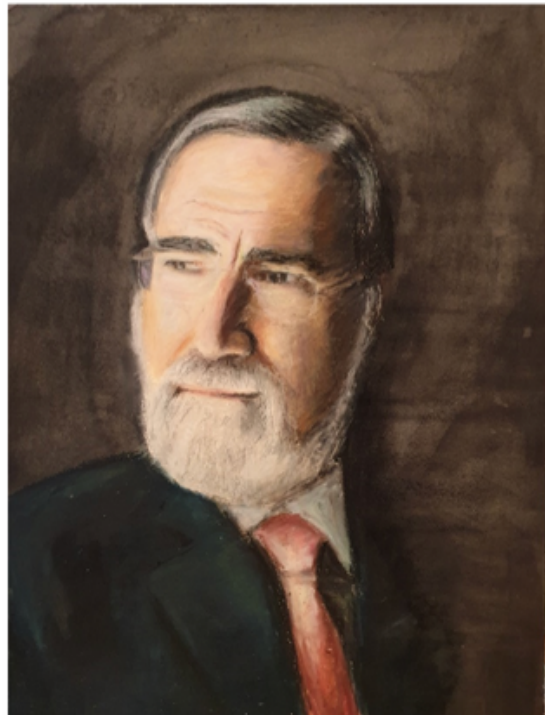
