Message from the President: Elections are in the air

A few of our agile BB members managed to quietly escape to Sydney or the Gold Coast just before the gates closed for Melbourne's 4th hard COVID lockdown. Lucky you.

Back here in Melbourne, many small businesses are really struggling to survive now and local shopping centres in Caulfield and St Kilda feature empty shops with 'for lease' signs in the windows. Everyone is trying to adapt, including our Units and projects who had to reorganise most of the functions they have organised for June and early July. It's not much fun, but as Eli Wiesel commented to his wife when he lost his life savings to that Ponzi swindler Bernie Madoff a few years ago: "We have seen worse". He is right. We have seen worse.

In Australia and other Western countries, most of us believed, after the Holocaust, that anti-Semitism was a thing of the past and will be confined to a small looney fringe of society. We were sadly mistaken. This was spelled out to us at last month's meeting of the Jewish Community Council of Victoria (JCCV) when the staff of the Community Security Group (CSG) reported on the rising number of anti-Jewish and anti-Zionism/anti-Israel incidents in Victoria over the past year. Fortunately, their well-trained staff with over 100 volunteers help to keep us safe. They have developed extensive working relationships with Victoria Police and other security agencies. I am also glad that we are housed at Beth Weizmann, where security for tenants and visitors is taken really seriously. There is a new App you can download from the App Store to your phone if you need to contact the CSG or the Hatzolah first medical responders. This Jewish Emergency Application is called JEAP.

Additionally, a hearty Mazal Tov to Izi Marmur on his OAM for his service to the Jewish community in the Australian Society of Polish Jews and their Descendants.

In the next couple of months, most of our Units will have their Annual General Meetings and elect or re-elect their executives officers. This also applies to our Victorian B'nai B'rith Council (VBBC) whose AGM is on July 8th. The Council consists of all the elected Unit Presidents and Co-Presidents, plus the BBVic Executive and a few others who help to run the BBVic organisation.

This group has worked very hard and harmoniously over the past two years and I'd like to now thank all of them sincerely for their work during their term of office. The Executive members have been: Kath Kolb, Stephen and Sue Moskowitz, Faye Haskin-Dubrowin and co-opted members Tania Tobias, Peter Schattner, Karin Zafir and Jacqui Dinor-Corry. Thank you for a job well done.

There is consensus, I think, that we want the new Council and Executive to be elected at the AGM to continue on our current path. We want to continue to grow to become a strong, effective Jewish community service organisation that also satisfies the cultural and social needs of our members. To achieve this mix will require hard work, a clear strategy and clever marketing. Units and projects will need to work collaboratively with us and our CEO to achieve these goals. So let's make a toast to B'nai B'rith. L'chaim.

Message from the BBANZ President



It has been a busy but enjoyable month for Sue and me in relation to a number of BB events and issues.

In mid-May, we drove to Melbourne for the first time since the last triennial conference which was held in September 2019. It was lovely to drive down to Melbourne unhindered. Of course we visited family and friends but we also made a point, over the 12 days we were there, to meet as many Victorian members as we could and attend whatever BB functions we could.

All the members of BB Victoria whom we had the pleasure of meeting were extremely hospitable to us and we had a number of good and meaningful discussions. We would like to take this opportunity to thank all those people we met for your warmth and kindness.

The highlight for Sue and me was attending the delayed 75th anniversary of BB in Victoria. It had been delayed by a year for obvious reasons. The function was well attended by people in person and some by Zoom. A movie prepared in-house was shown which highlighted a number of the achievements and way of life of BB Victoria over those 75 years. As the brochure advertising the function said "Join us on a journey through our rich history". What a journey it has been! Well done to all those people involved in the making of this journey.

The function was a great success and little did anyone know at the time (23rd May) that 4 days later they would all be in lockdown again. At the time of writing this report, the lockdown has been somewhat eased and I sincerely hope that everything gets back to normal quickly. Sue and I missed the lockdown by a day, returning to NSW a day before it happened. If only we had known that this was coming to Sydney!

On the 9th June Sue and I, along with other BB members, attended NSW State Parliament at the invitation of Ernie Frielander OAM, President of the Alfred Dreyfus Unit. The event of which Ernie was a driving force, was 'Stop Racism Now'. The Governor of NSW, Margaret Beasley was in attendance along with a number of politicians from both sides of Parliament. The event was very well presented with a number of interesting speakers.

On the subject of racism and anti-Semitism, this year has unfortunately seen a big rise in anti-Semitic and racist incidents. Whilst in Melbourne, I attended a special meeting via Zoom with BB International which discussed this issue and more recently I attended the bi-monthly meeting of the Executive Council of Australian Jewry on behalf of BB which also discussed this issue. Efforts are being made, both here and overseas, to overcome the perceived bias of the press, both mainstream and social, to anti-Semitism which has come to the forefront again since the conflict with Gaza.

Last year, the 25th anniversary of the BBVic Jewish Youth Art Competition was an entirely online affair. During his pre-recorded opening address BBVic President, Dr Benny Monheit said: "In this silver anniversary year of the competition, the dark clouds of the global pandemic have a silver lining; namely, our resilience and resourcefulness as a community to overcome obstacles and celebrate the creativity and talent of our young artists". Today, twelve months later, the obstacles are no less challenging. The Glen Eira Town Hall Gallery has recently re-opened after a three-week lock-down. Hopefully, it will remain open for the exhibition, including the opening ceremony on 25th July. If not, our back-up plan is to stage an online exhibition with a number of virtual galleries. Given the uncertainty, this means we need to be prepared for both eventualities.
