Message from the President...on managing controversies



It is not easy to manage major controversies. Let us look at two examples. Half the adult population of Israel say that the judicial reforms advocated by Netanyahu's government is a power grab by the Knesset; the other half say that the judges already have too much power, more than in any other Western democracy, and a balance needs to be restored. President Herzog is trying to work out how to reach a compromise with this controversial legislation.

The second example is the Voice to Parliament. Again, polls tell us that about half of the Australian adult population think that giving First Nations a constitutionally entrenched 'voice' is a reasonable and fair thing to do. The other half are unconvinced, with many stating that a bureaucratic structure which singles out a specific racial group is divisive and unlikely to 'close the gap' between Aborigines and the rest of Australia. How do you manage this controversy without increasing the tension between opposing points of view?

While not on the same scale as these two examples, B'nai B'rith Victoria also has its controversies. How do we forge our way to a successful future without reforming current approaches? Change will inevitably lead to some pushback by members who are concerned about the cost of new initiatives, the departure from ways that seemed to work in the past and trying things which involve a degree of risk.

Some of the changes on the B'nai B'rith horizon include:

- 1) A completely revised website
- 2) The acquisition of a far more functional database system (Zoho)
- 3) Creating new partnerships such as the most recent one with 'Mitzvah Day', an established charitable organisation
- 4) The development of an 'Innovation Board' which will be responsible for seed-funding trial projects
- 5) A formalised marketing plan which emphasises the role of B'nai B'rith as a whole rather than its constituent parts
- 6) A comprehensive income generation strategy that seeks new ways of bringing in additional revenue, including a broader approach to fund-raising now that we have obtained DGR status for our Scholarship Fund (and are still waiting on the outcome for the Cultural Fund).

All of these and more are currently being developed and some are on the brink of implementation. There will be costs involved and there will be an element of risk. There will be heated discussion although I doubt that we will see hundreds of members demonstrating in the streets. The push for change must be managed by the B'nai B'rith Vic Executive, the CEO and listening to your voices. However, we cannot allow ourselves to stagnate because we are afraid of creating controversies.

News from BBANZ



When I read in the weekend newspaper that the latest Artificial Intelligence program called ChatGPT-4 performed better than doctors in reading X rays and scored better than most law graduates sitting for bar exams in the US, I sat bolt upright. Wow – this is amazing! This development could really change the way we can get answers to complex questions. But the real test for us is: Could artificial Intelligence (AI) help B'nai B'rith? To find out, I typed the following question into the ChatGPT4 program:

Question: B'nai B'rith in Australia is a Jewish service organisation involved also in human rights. How can we increase membership?

Within **less than one second** it came up with this sophisticated reply:

Increasing membership in any organisation can be a challenging task, but there are some strategies that you could consider for B'nai Brith in Australia:

1. Promote the organisation's mission and values: Make sure that people are aware of what B'nai Brith stands for and its core values. Use social media, newsletters, and other forms of communication to highlight the organisation's work, such as its involvement in human rights issues.
2. Host events: Organise events that will bring people together and showcase the organisation's work. These events could be cultural, educational, or social in nature and could include guest speakers, performances, or workshops.
3. Leverage existing members: Encourage existing members to bring their friends and family members to events, and to talk about the organisation's work and mission.
4. Collaborate with other organisations: B'nai Brith can collaborate with other organisations that share similar values or goals. This can help expand its reach and attract new members who are interested in the organisation's work.
5. Use targeted advertising through social media and other platforms to reach people who may be interested in joining the organisation. For example, B'nai Brith could advertise to people who have shown an interest in Jewish or human rights issues.
6. Offer incentives: Consider offering incentives for new members, such as discounts on events, or access to exclusive content.

Remember that increasing membership is an ongoing process and may require a combination of different strategies over time.

Less than one second to generate this free advice! I know it's nothing original, but it's an excellent summary of our current strategy that we have developed over the past 2-3 years.

I wonder if AI could solve the other big issue in Jewish life...the awful situation in Israel where society is tearing itself apart over the past 12 weeks over judicial reform and Israel/Palestinian issues. For us all who love Israel, it is frightening and distressing to watch from afar. The ChatGPT program comes up with no answer (I did try). How can we help achieve part of our motto which states: "B'nai B'rith is a staunch defender of the State of Israel"?

This is where humans need to take the lead. Even the non-political Sephardic Chief Rabbi of Israel, Yitzhak Yosef, has called for all sides to come to the table. President Isaac Herzog has done the same. It's the intelligent thing to do. Let's hope and pray they can work it out, without any artificial or external influences. Let's support our Israel projects to the max to show we care.

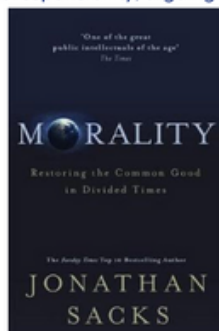
B'NAI B'RITH JEWISH NON-FICTION BOOK CLUB

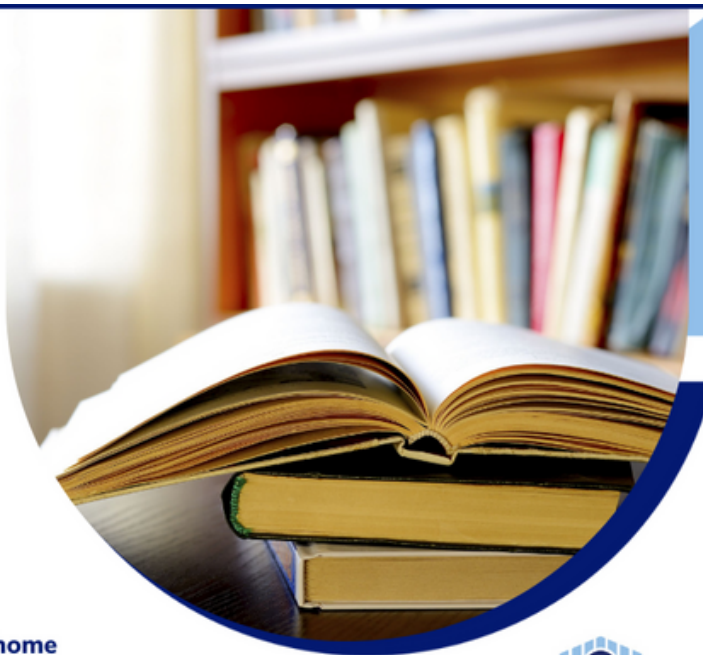
