Message from the President...on B'nai B'rith and The Voice



The Executive of B'nai B'rith Victoria has voted by consensus agreement to support the 'Yes' case in the referendum on an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice. I wish to give you a personal explanation of why I support us joining the Jewish Community Council of Victoria (JCCV), the Executive Council of Australian Jewry (ECAJ) and many other Jewish organisations in accepting the Yes case.

I have had many email exchanges about the forthcoming referendum with the chair of our Reconciliation Project, Jack Aghion, and I thank him for his tireless efforts in organising relevant educational events for our members and the broader community. I therefore reiterate that these are my personal views.

I believe we will only have one opportunity to engage with the Voice proposal. I have accepted the argument that continuing to do what we have done for our First Nations in the past will not work, whereas a Voice might shift the dial a little. This is not guaranteed but given the extent of the consultation that has occurred over many years on this matter, there is a chance that this will help address significant issues in disadvantaged Aboriginal communities. Trying to do our best for these communities is very much in line with B'nai B'rith's values. The only proviso is that the passing of a referendum on the Voice does not lead to unintended consequences. There is a long list of these potential problems and I do not have the space here to go over what has been widely canvassed in the media.

Essentially, I think it comes down to where you think the balance of probabilities lie. It is not possible to be completely certain about future outcomes. Let me give just two examples of arguments put forward by the No case. One is that the Voice will divide Australia by race by giving power to one group which has not been given to any other group. However, I believe that giving additional assistance to our First Nations, who were treated terribly by our British colonial predecessors, and who still suffer intergenerational trauma, is not divisive. In my view the Voice is more likely to lead to reconciliation than by continuing on our current path.

A second argument is that newly proposed legislation will be held up by the Voice challenging Parliament in the High Court, complaining that politicians have not fulfilled their constitutional responsibilities by, for example, not giving the Voice sufficient time to investigate a particular issue. Do you believe that Parliament will be tied up in legal knots? I don't accept this view but I cannot prove that it won't be. I take it that on the balance of probabilities, this assertion as well as several others, seem unlikely to eventuate.

This is how I have come to be a supporter of the Yes case – cautiously, understanding counter-arguments, and agreeing that sometimes in life you have to take a small risk if you believe you are doing the right thing. I make no assumption about how many of our members agree with the decision your Executive representatives have made, and obviously you will decide on which way you will vote in the referendum. But you should know that the Executive and I will not be fence-sitters on this issue. I am pleased that B'nai B'rith Victoria has taken a stand.

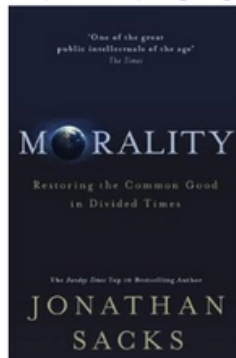
B'NAI B'RITH JEWISH NON-FICTION BOOK CLUB

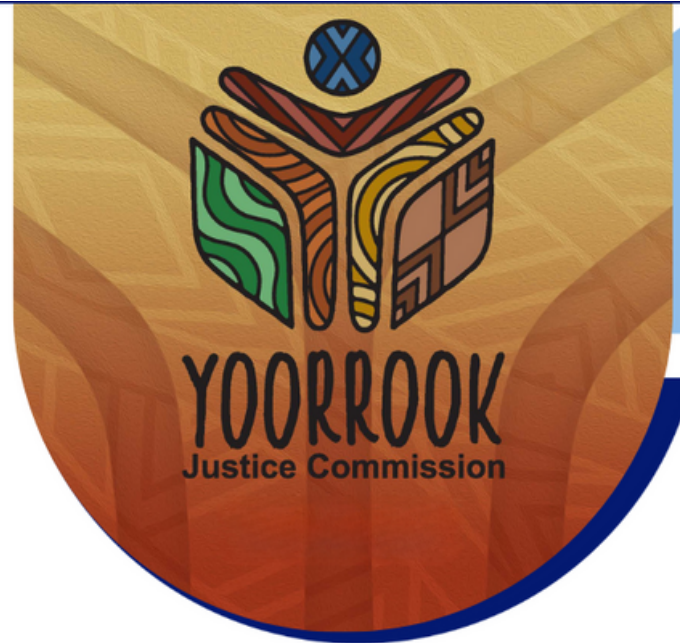

B'nai B'rith Partnership with Save A Child's Heart

In front of an engaged and enthralled audience, Doron Lazarus, CEO of SACH Australia explained that the organisation has been saving children from countries without access to critical cardiac care for over 25 years. It all began in 1995 when a colleague of Dr Ami Cohen, a recent 'Oleh' and Head of the Pediatric Cardiac Unit of the Wolfson Medical Centre in Holon called and asked him to help him save two Ethiopian children in desperate need of heart surgery. Ami made it happen and hosted the children in his home during their recovery. Guided by his ethos of "if we can we should", SACH was born and began bringing children from all over the world to Israel for cardiac treatment, free of charge.

Since 1995, SACH has saved more than 6,500 lives from no less than 67 countries. Notably nearly half of these children are Palestinian.

In order to extend the impact and longevity of SACH's work, the organisation now trains doctors in Israel so that they are able to establish paediatric cardiac care in their own countries.

B'nai B'rith Victoria and NSW are excited to announce a partnership with SACH to raise critical funds to provide medication for the Children's Home, where the children remain following their surgery.

Child Life Therapy week – Calico Doll Competition at The Royal Children's Hospital (RCH)

B'nai B'rith is a proud supporter of the RCH Foundation and the Child Life Therapy (CLT) program at the RCH, supplying the department with hundreds of calico dolls each year for use with patients.

Last week was CLT week, and the RCH CLT team asked RCH staff to decorate a calico doll to represent their department. The RCH staff didn't disappoint, and the RCH CLT team was amazed & blown away by the entries. RCH Child Life Therapists use calico dolls primarily to prepare children for hospital procedures. The Child Life Therapists use these dolls to demonstrate the procedure; with the child participating as much as possible – the child might draw a face, add clothing or simply decorate the doll however they wish.

Many RCH departments shared that this competition was a playful activity that brought so much joy and camaraderie this week. And the winners were:

Winner: Prosthetics and Orthotics department – their doll was chosen because of their attention to detail and use of real equipment. It represents their department with a Boston brace attached to a halo, a shoe raise on the right foot and a three-point splint on the left leg.

Runner Up: Medical Imaging (MRI department) – their doll was chosen because of the addition of the MRI machine, IVC for contrast, scrubs, headphones and movie helmet. It is a great representation of what children can expect when having an MRI; minus the clangy bangy sounds!

Honourable mention: Music Therapy and their Harry Styles doll – because we all need a little sparkle in our lives.

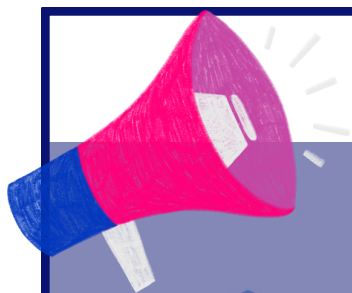

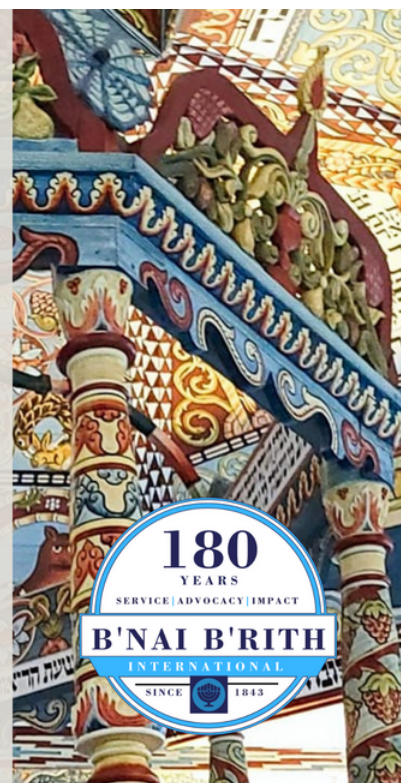
