Message from the President... on the B'nai B'rith Triennial Convention



The general theme for the Convention, which will be held in Canberra's ACT Jewish Community Centre from Friday 29 August till mid-day on Monday 1 September, is 'B'nai B'rith: Into the Future'.

The sub-themes are:

- 1) Modernising and strengthening B'nai B'rith in the region
- 2) B'nai B'rith's role in combatting antisemitism, and
- 3) B'nai B'rith's role in supporting Israel.

For the first sub-theme, lessons will be offered by various external speakers so that delegates from New Zealand, New South Wales and Victoria will be better able to recommend realistic, modernising strategies for B'nai B'rith. The second and third sub-themes will emphasise what B'nai B'rith can realistically do at the regional levels. This will not involve major political efforts as these will be undertaken by our Jewish roof bodies and main Zionist organisations.

Discussions on combatting antisemitism have too often focused on legal and political dimensions and not enough on what we can do to strengthen ourselves. Every Jew should be responsible for defining who they are, and what being Jewish means to them. The promotion of pride in Jewish identity is certainly something that B'nai B'rith in Melbourne, Sydney and New Zealand can and should regard as core business.

To some extent, this can be conducted with the ABC of Jewish identity spoken of by the late Rabbi Jonathan Sacks. 'A' stands for affective, 'B' for behavioural and 'C' for cognitive. That is, our identity is largely based on how we feel, act and think. Knowledge about our religion, history and culture is a major enabler of the ABC of Jewish identity. Similarly, support for Israel is not only political or through donations; it also involves 'connection', and the same ABC concept applies.

The Triennial Convention does not aim to be a talk-fest on what B'nai B'rith should do in the future. Instead, it intends to create a broad but practical program of B'nai B'rith strengthening the ABC of Jewish identity, and through that, working against antisemitism and for Israel.

The celebration of the 80 year anniversary of B'nai B'rith Victoria on May 20th at Beth Weizmann was a joyful event. Thank you Ellana, Chana and Joey for pulling it all together. Denise and I just missed out on getting the 50 year membership medal as we have been members for only 44 years. The key events for me during that time was the formation and growth of the B'nai B'rith Anti Defamation Commission, and Courage to Care and more recently Click and Connect.

I also value the lifelong friendships we have made through our Unit. What are your highlights? The sale of the Lodge Home in Hotham Street was the low point, but it forced us to move with the times financially and administratively.

Jews form only 0.2% of the world population. That we have survived to the present time is almost a miracle. How we have done that is open to debate, but having a moral and practical code for living in society with our Torah is a big factor.

B'nai B'rith also learnt to adapt and survive. We are seeing ongoing changes in both Victoria and NSW in membership policies and the role of Units and their interaction with the office. I think we will also succeed in developing closer links with BB Israel and their team, led by Manny Cohen, as they have expressed eagerness to do so.

I will be finishing my three year role as President of B'nai B'rith Australia/New Zealand in August 2025 when Janine Zimble from Sydney will take over at our Canberra Convention. Thank you for your support during the years. I enjoyed my term but will be glad to retire and hand over to Janine and her new team to continue our ongoing journey in B'nai B'rith.

COURAGE TO CARE UPDATE

ALKIRA SECONDARY COLLEGE 12TH HOLOCAUST CEREMONY



Courage to Care Victoria was honoured to once again support Alkira Secondary College's annual Holocaust Remembrance Ceremony, held this year on the significant date of May 8th – marking the 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE) Day.

Located in Cranbourne, Alkira Secondary College is a diverse and inclusive school community with over 2,000 students from more than 50 cultural backgrounds. The solemn ceremony, now in its 12th year, was led by the school's Year 9 to Year 12 student leaders, with the audience comprising Year 9 and 10 students. The event continues to grow in prominence, serving as a powerful educational opportunity and reminder of the importance of remembering the atrocities of the Holocaust.

This year's ceremony also welcomed guests from McKinnon Secondary College, Mount Scopus Memorial College, and Heritage College – the latter of which is set to hold its own Holocaust Remembrance event, inspired by Alkira's longstanding tradition.

The initiative began over a decade ago thanks to the dedication of two teachers, Kristine Wolfe and Nicole Scott, who were inspired to start the ceremony after participating in the Gandel Holocaust Studies Program for Australian Educators at Yad Vashem in Israel. Their vision has evolved into a respected and moving annual event.

A highlight of this year's ceremony was a heartfelt speech delivered by former Courage to Care Vice Chair, Les Kausman OAM, who reflected on the enduring legacy of Holocaust education and the profound effect it has had on students over the years.

Students were deeply moved by a personal testimony from Holocaust survivor Peter Gaspar OAM. His story of survival and resilience held the audience spellbound, offering a firsthand account of the horrors of the Holocaust and the strength of the human spirit. Peter's presence provided a rare and powerful connection to history that many students will remember for a lifetime.

Courage to Care commended Alkira Secondary College for its commitment to Holocaust education and the preservation of memory through student engagement, reflection, and leadership. As antisemitism and racism continue to pose global challenges, initiatives like these serve as a vital reminder of the lessons of history and the courage it takes to care.
