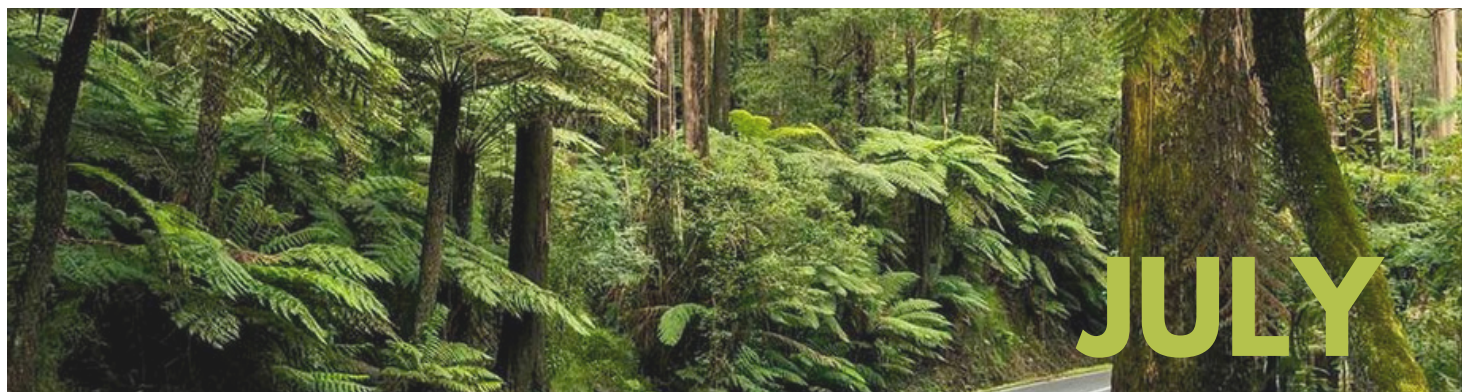

Message from the President... on the B'nai B'rith's role in combatting antisemitism



B'nai B'rith Victoria is a member of the Jewish Community Council of Victoria (JCCV) and one of my responsibilities is to be one of several BBVic representatives to the roof body. I attended the most recent meeting on the 16th of June which presented JCCV's study, *Turning Point*, on the state of our community since October 7, 2023. There were three speakers who described the following:

- Our community has been experiencing unprecedented levels of anxiety, exclusion and distress
- Many have endured a psychological toll with feelings of fear, abandonment and trauma, and
- The profound marginalisation within the Jewish arts community, including the silencing of Jewish voices.

This made me think deeply about the role that B'nai B'rith can play in supporting those who have been impacted. Obviously, there are several organisations who undertake a direct political role and many of them are engaged in presenting a pro-Jewish and pro-Israel viewpoint within the media. There is no need to further saturate this activity with another voice.

What we have committed to doing, though, is provide a sense of community for our members and other people who participate in our activities. This is about strengthening resilience and there are many aspects to this. Although some will benefit from individual psychological counselling, as a group, we can feel better about ourselves if we know more about our rich history, culture and religion.

To support the arts sector, B'nai B'rith has partnered with the Centre of Jewish Artists (COJA), opening space during the Youth Art Competition exhibition in the Glen Eira Gallery for those artists who have been doxxed and cancelled. I encourage you all to take some time, now that the exhibition is open, to support them. We have also established a grant program to assist those working to combat antisemitism at the grassroots level (click [here](#) for more information).

The BBANZ Triennial Convention in Canberra from 29 August to 1 September will include a workshop on the role of B'nai B'rith in supporting its members and also people from within the Jewish community who are increasingly attracted to our programs and events. You are invited to the Convention and to contribute to this workshop.

Finally, and not unrelated, we remain steadfast in our support of Israel during these difficult times. At the time of writing, while a ceasefire is in place, the outcome of the war on Iran's nuclear and ballistic missile programs remains unclear, but what is obvious is that once again, our brothers and sisters in Israel are bearing a significant price. BBVic is inviting you to donate as generously as you can to help B'nai B'rith Israel in its work to provide on-the-ground support to individuals and families whose homes have been destroyed by the recent missile attacks. In addition to our support of BB Israel, B'nai B'rith ANZ Israel Commission supports 5 projects across Israel:

In **Bersheva** - Be'er Sova, "a restaurant for the needy" where up to 100 receive a nourishing hot meal for only a couple shekels.

In **Karmiel** - a Children's Village. Ages ranging from toddlers to teenagers fostered by families living in the Village – where they live until they join the army.

In **Sderot** - many of its young people are extremely traumatized by rocket attacks. A large number are of Ethiopian descent and their parents do not have the skills to assist them. The I.C. has furnished and equipped a Community Centre, where psychological help is provided and where they can safely meet and socialize.

In **Jaffo** - Jaffa Institute for Higher Education runs a large food distribution centre - distributing hundreds of food parcels each week, as well as providing after-school tuition and care. Providing shelter and education to children at risk. Integrated drug prevention program. Schools for young Sudanese migrants assisting with their integration into Israeli society, as well as integration of Somalians through artistic workshops. Summer camps and Scholarships for higher education is also provided.

In **Bet Oved** - supporting the Israeli Guide Dog Institute.

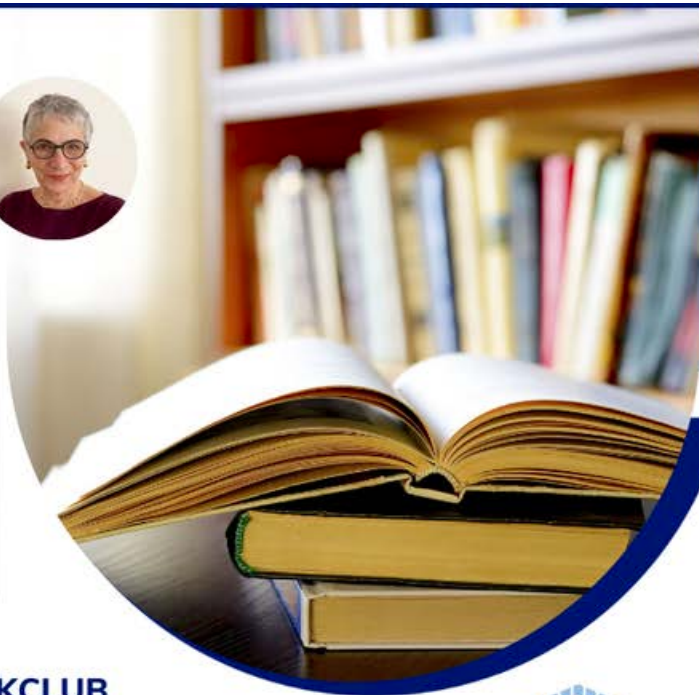

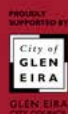

CHAIR OF B'NAI B'RITH COURAGE TO CARE



It is with profound sadness that we announce the passing of our Chair, Judy Glick. We express our deepest sorrow at this heartbreaking loss. Judy was not only our Chair but also the inaugural Chair of our national entity, Courage to Care Australia Ltd, a role she accepted with humility and dedication in late 2023.

Judy joined Courage to Care as a volunteer in March 2019 and immediately offered her expertise in fundraising development. Her passion was evident from day one, and it wasn't long before she became an integral part of our

Marketing and Fundraising team. She joined the Committee of Management at our 2019 AGM, was elected Vice Chair in 2020, and then Chair in 2022, succeeding Dr Tony Weldon OAM FRACP who had served in the role for 17 years.

Judy helped guide our organisation through some of its most challenging and transformative years, including COVID-19, and subsequent period during which our impact tripled in size. She was instrumental in helping us navigate difficult times following October 7, always leading with calm, compassion and unwavering commitment.

What many may not know—because Judy was so modest—is just how deeply she cared. She never sought the spotlight, always putting Courage to Care first.

Judy made our organisation better. She made our society better—through our growing impact in schools and communities across Australia. And, by her example, she made us better people.

Judy was admired and respected by all who had the privilege of working alongside her, and we extend our sympathy to her husband Leslie, children Jeremy and Lydia and her grandchildren whom she adored.

Her loss is hard to comprehend. But as we try to make sense of it, we hold tight to the saying: 'May her memory be a blessing'.

Judy's memory is a blessing—one that will live on through every Upstander we inspire, every young person we reach, and every moment we strive to do good in the world.
