Message from the Vice President: What is the balance of opinion?



There is justifiably a high level of concern at the level of antisemitism in Australia within our B'nai B'rith community – and support for our initiative, within our limited capacity, to provide funding for two projects which aim to confront this threat.

Indicative of the current mood, this week Rabbi Ralph Genende, writing in the Israeli newspaper Haaretz, commented that “the proud multiculturalism has become a place of malign malaise, of uncertainty, and of fear for its Jewish citizens.”

The Comprehensive Action Plan to Combat Antisemitism by the government appointed Special Envoy to Combat Antisemitism, Jillian Segal AO, was welcomed in July by ECAJ President Daniel Aghion as “a very well-considered plan and fully aligned with the ECAJ's thinking and our community's expectations.” Within days of its release, it was subject to a campaign of misinformation and its recommendations seem to have been sidelined, with limited action so far.

The situation is dire, but we should not lose track of the reality that while the small number of activists on the far left and the far right win much attention in the media, they do not speak for the majority of our fellow Australians.

This month's Resolve Political Monitor poll, published in The Age, asked for views on the recognition of a Palestinian state. It found that only 24% support recognising a Palestinian state without preconditions, while a much larger proportion, 44% of Australians, oppose now recognising a Palestinian state under any conditions and 32% support only on the condition that Hamas is first removed from power.

The authoritative Scanlon Foundation social cohesion survey, which has been conducted annually since 2009, asks respondents for their attitude to different faith groups. **It comes as a surprise that a higher proportion of Australians are negative towards Christians than towards Jews.**

In the most recent survey that has been published, conducted in July 2024, 13% were negative towards Hindus, 13% negative towards Jews, 19% negative towards Christians, and a much higher 34% negative towards Muslims.

But in a finding that should concern government, negative attitude to most faith groups has increased – and indicators of social cohesion are below the long-term average, down from the Index score of 89 in 2020, when Australians united to defeat the crisis posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, to 78 in 2024.

Many of our friends have abandoned us on the world stage, but we have each other and we have Israel. We can get through this phase. B'nai B'rith can help in many different ways but the main way now our communal leaders feel is to support the Jewish community in Australia in as many ways as possible. This can be via collaborating on social, educational and cultural functions to show we are strong and proud. Supporting the people of Israel is also part of our motto. We have adopted this approach in B'nai B'rith and have seen a gratifying increase in member participation and non-members turning up to our functions.

At the Triennial Convention in Canberra we will be looking at how we can continue to adapt to changing social and political circumstances.

The Convention also marks the end of my three-year term of office as President of BBANZ. I will be handing over to the very capable Janine Zimble from Sydney. I want to thank the members of my Board. It has been a very positive experience for me and a great honour.

With New Year and Yom Kippur fast approaching I thank you for your support and wish you Shana Tova and well over the Fast.

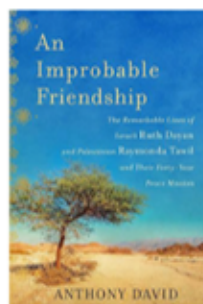


B'NAI B'RITH JEWISH NON-FICTION BOOK CLUB
