Message from the President: The need for resilience



There are a number of events in very recent times that make me think about resilience. First and foremost this involves Israel, especially now that there is a tentative ceasefire for the October 7 Israel-Hamas war. Israel faces a prolonged period of healing, none more so than for the many of hostages and Israeli soldiers who have suffered physical and psychological trauma. Nevertheless, Israel is in a stronger military position than it was two years ago, and hopefully, if the ceasefire lasts, Israel is very likely to recover and indeed thrive within an

improved environment. This recovery takes place in the face of widespread ostracism by nations that could and should have provided a more sympathetic public stand. The constant criticism functioned as an enabler of unhinged anti-Zionism amongst certain groups which spilled over into Jew-hatred. The feelings of anxiety and concern about safety among Jewish communities in many countries, including Australia, led many Jews to ask: 'How can we combat antisemitism?'

However, this is not the right question as antisemitism is not the fault of the Jews. It is the fault of the antisemites. But it is in our power to strengthen our own resolve against hate by improving our resilience, and that is what we must do.

B'nai B'rith does not dwell on the hundreds if not thousands of years of Jews being the perennial victims. Rather, we fortify our resilience by celebrating our traditions, religion and history. B'nai B'rith's projects and programs do this, as does our fostering of social connections between us.

B'nai B'rith as an organisation is also going through a period of challenge, although this is trivial compared to the travails of Israel. Our CEO, Ellana Aarons, will be stepping down at the end of November, after a five year transformational contribution, and Chana Mishulovin, our administrative assistant who contributed so much to our improved communication, will be leaving soon after. They have both achieved a great deal in the several years that they have been with us, and I thank them for all they have done and wish them well in the future.

B'nai B'rith will be resilient. We will get through this transition and will continue to fulfill an important need in Melbourne.

So, whether it be Israel, Jewish communities everywhere or B'nai B'rith here, the common solution is – resilience.

We are starting to discuss district wide common projects with our essay competition being first cab off the rank in the new year.

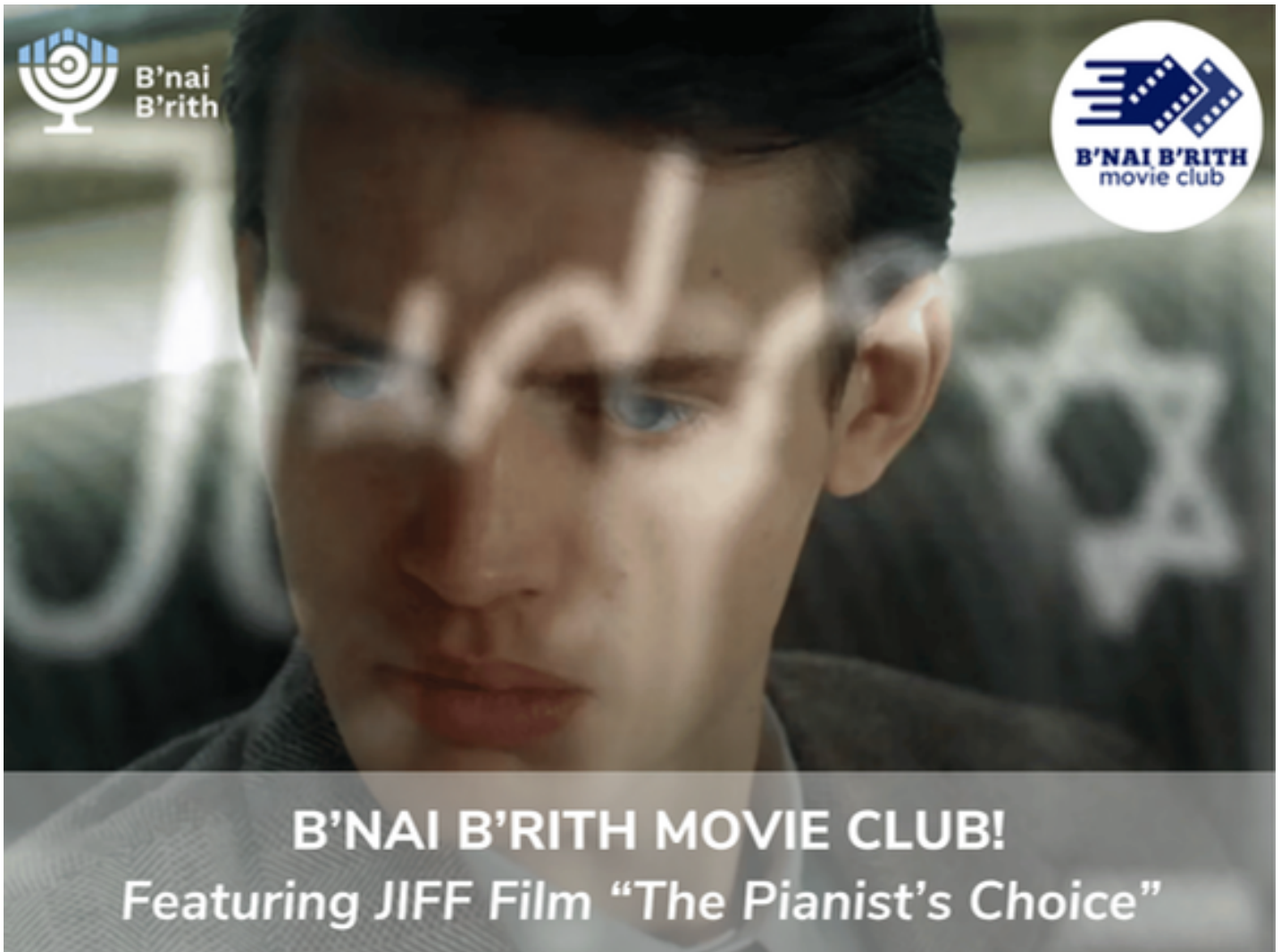

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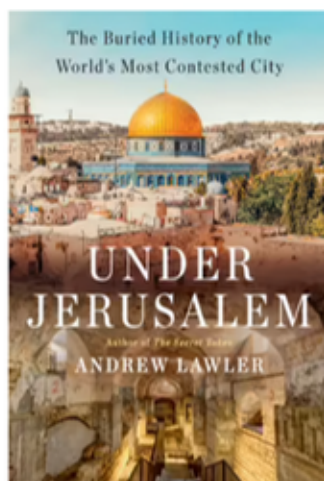


B'NAI B'RITH JEWISH NON-FICTION BOOK CLUB

A current teacher and member of the Co-Curricular Jewish Education team at Mount Scopus, Sasha Fink has made significant contributions to Jewish education and school life. She rewrote the Year 10 Holocaust Studies Elective curriculum and is actively involved with the non-profit organisation Flying Fox. Sasha has commenced a Master of Education at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, specialising in Jewish Education, alongside classes at the Pardes Institute to deepen her informal and textual Jewish learning. She intends to return to Mount Scopus as an even more informed, passionate, and committed educator, further enriching the school community.

The Board of Trustees was very impressed with Sasha's application and awarded her with a full scholarship.



Justice, belonging, and education have guided David Loven throughout his community service journey. From high school, he volunteered with BBYO and UJEB, fostering connection and safety for Jewish students who often felt isolated in public schools. As President of the Jewish Student Society at Monash University, David has created spaces of resilience, joy, and cross-cultural engagement that have positively impacted countless students. His work on a Victorian Department of Education Committee investigating antisemitism in schools further deepened his commitment to education as a means of combatting racism and promoting empathy.

David has been awarded a travel grant to attend the Prato Program in Italy, where he will study European Economy and Global Business. His long-term vision is to establish a global network of engineers and STEM professionals dedicated to consulting on sustainable infrastructure and technology projects in developing nations, particularly across the Indo-Pacific.

BBANZ TRIENNIAL CONVENTION

B'nai B'rith Australia/New Zealand Charts Bold Future at Triennial Convention in Canberra

The B'nai B'rith Australia/New Zealand Triennial Convention on 31 August - 1 September 2025 brought together 80 members and guests in Canberra to shape the organisation's strategic vision for the next three years.

The Convention drew strong support from high profile speakers, including Mark Leach (Never Again is Now), The Hon. Dr. Mike Kelly AM, Tahli Blicblau (CEO, The Dor Foundation), and Tom Curtis (Chair, Courage to Care Australia). Together, they sparked vital conversations about B'nai B'rith's role in combating antisemitism and fostering community resilience. Their insights galvanised attendees to explore innovative strategies for engagement and advocacy.

The convention concluded with a Gala Dinner at the ACT Community Centre, attended by distinguished guests, including Amir Meron, Deputy Chief of Mission at the Israeli Embassy, and Athol Morris, President of the ACT Jewish Community. The evening saw Janine Zimbler inaugurated as the newly elected President of B'nai B'rith ANZ, succeeding Dr. Benny Monheit, who concluded his three-year term during a complex and challenging period for Jewish organisations globally.

In her inspiring acceptance speech, Janine outlined her vision: "I am committed to taking a fresh look at how people engage with B'nai B'rith and encouraging new ways for members to participate in our wide-ranging projects and activities, both in Australia and internationally."

Having spearheaded significant revitalisation efforts in B'nai B'rith NSW over the past four years, Janine is poised to lead the district with dynamic vision and innovation throughout her coming three-year presidency.

The new executive of BBANZ consists of President Janine Zimbler, Secretary Iain Messer, Treasurer John Szabo, Anna Marks OAM and Vera Cranston representing B'nai B'rith NSW, Associate Professor Dr Peter Schattner and Professor Emeritus Andrew Markus AO representing BB Victoria, Dr Jim Salinger CRSNZ representing BB New Zealand, with Anna Marks OAM retaining the position of Vice President of B'nai B'rith International.

The Convention concluded with a renewed sense of purpose, as members left Canberra equipped with a clear strategic direction and inspired to contribute to B'nai B'rith's mission over the coming three years.
